**Bunco is an easy, interactive dice game. Couples and singles are welcome. Come to learn or if you already play, come help others.**

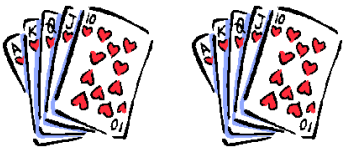

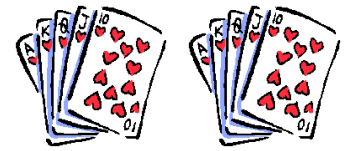
